Priority 1: Year-End Financials/FY 21 Budget

- Regular presentation of financial reports to PUAB
- Development of FY 20-21 Preliminary Budget by 1/31/20
- Develop financial policies consistent with industry best practices

Priority 2: Updated IPL Rate Structure

- Develop and present a rate structure that meets the previous direction of the City Council:
 - 6% rate reduction for all customers
 - Simplified customer classification

Priority 3: Selection of IPL Management Firm

- Six responses to received to Request for Proposals
- Selection Committee has narrowed the list to 3 firms
 - Baker Tilly LLC
 - DKMT Consulting
 - MPUA
- Setting up interviews

Priority 4: Blue Valley Plant Closure

- Staff Reductions
 - Discontinue plant operations by 6/1/20
 - \$3.5 million savings
 - Negotiations underway with IBEW
- Plant Repurposing
 - Execute plant closure
 - Identify repurposing plan
 - Consultant report on repurposing completed
 - Issue Request for Information for potential repurposing concepts

Priority 5: Management Analyst Audit

- August 2019: Management Analyst assigned audit of IPL
 - Immediate finding regarding payroll internal controls
 - City Manager directed to review and report findings to City Council by 2/7/20
 - Report triggered automatic review by City's external auditor. To be completed by March 2020.
- Overtime and standby pay
 - Long-standing area of concern
 - Changes will be implemented in next 30-45 days to ensure consistency in practices along with fair compensation to affected employees.

Priority 6: Future of IPL Production

- Combustion turbines nearing end of useful life
- Need to develop alternative solutions to peak load capacity
- Do have some time to make thoughtful decisions
- City Council adopted resolution at 1/21 meeting directing City
 Manager to evaluate options and develop recommendations

Priority 7: Municipal Broadband

- Evaluate potential deployment of a municipal broadband network
- Opportunities:
 - Enhance quality of life for Independence residents
 - Business attraction/economic development
 - Enhanced pricing/customer service from private sector
 - Revenue stream to support other basic services
- Much groundwork has been completed; business plan needs to be updated
- Ideal outcome: Public-Private Partnership



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
