A RESOLUTION CONVEYING THE CITY COUNCIL'S INTENT TO RETIRE THE BLUE VALLEY INDEPENDENCE POWER AND LIGHT POWER PLANT AND PROVIDE GUIDANCE ON FUTURE IMPLEMENTATION TO PROVIDE GENERATING CAPACITY AND A TRANSITION OF AFFECTED INDEPENDENCE POWER AND LIGHT EMPLOYEES.

WHEREAS, the City of Independence currently owns and operates a power plant known as Blue Valley which includes three turbines which have been operating for over 50 years; and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Valley plant in recent years has generated less the 2% of the city's total energy needs; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Independence has received an extensive master energy plan which has been presented to the City Council and the Public Utilities Advisory Board; and,

WHEREAS, the Master Energy recommended the retirement of the Blue Valley plant and exploring plans to replace the 98 MW generating capacity; and,

WHEREAS, a 2011 Master Energy plan also recommended the retirement of the Blue Valley plant; and,

WHEREAS, the current Master Energy plan projects the retirement of the Blue Valley plan would reduce annual power plant labor costs by \$3.6 million annually; and,

WHEREAS, the projected labor costs savings would provide funding with which to secure needed additional generating capacity potentially through a larger ownership interest in the Dogwood power plant; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council and the Public Utilities Advisory Board have both recommended seeking Requests for Proposal for to consider for providing additional generating capacity; and,

WHEREAS, the clear statement of our plans to retire Blue Valley power plan can assist providing clear direction of future plans by Independence Power and Light to provide electricity; and,

WHEREAS, time is needed to develop transition plans for affected Blue Valley production plant employees through job reassignment, retraining, retirement or severance; and,

WHEREAS, the timely retirement of the Blue Valley plant can save the utility significant monies on an annual basis and help provide more competitive utility rates; and,

WHEREAS, a clear decision on retirement of Blue Valley has direct bearing on the cost of service study currently underway;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDEPENDENCE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> The City Council formally endorses retirement of the Blue Valley power plant on or before June 1, 2020.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> That the City Council hereby directs the City Manager to undertake developing an overall plan that would include:

- 1.Retirement of the Blue Valley plant including ceasing power generation by Blue Valley units 1, 2 and 3.
- 2. Staffing plan for existing Blue Valley power production staff affected by retirement of the three generating units
- 3.Recommendations of the best and most cost-effective means to provide for replacement generating capacity based on information contained in the most recent Master Energy plan.
